# **Baptist Church (former)**

The timber church is the second Baptist Church in Petrie Terrace. The first was built in ca. 1870 behind the current church fronting Chapel Street. As the population of Petrie Terrace grew in the late nineteenth century, so too did the Baptist congregation. After several years of fundraising, enough money had been raised to build a larger church. In January 1895 the new church was opened with a series of services conducted over a day. Designed by Reverend W Richer, the church has played a large role in many Petrie Terrace residents' lives. It has recently been converted into a house.

## **Statement of significance**

### **Relevant assessment criteria**

This is a place of local heritage significance and meets one or more of the local heritage criteria under the Heritage planning scheme policy of the *Brisbane City Plan 2014*. It is significant because:

#### **Historical**

CRITERION A

The place is important in demonstrating the evolution or pattern of the city's or local area's history

as a late nineteenth-century timber church constructed for the growing Baptist congregation in Petrie Terrace.

#### Representative

**CRITERION D** 

The place is important in demonstrating the principal characteristics of a particular class or classes of cultural places

as a surviving example of a small, timber framed Carpenter Gothic style church built in the 1890s.
