This unusual Spanish Mission style duplex was constructed in 1938 as an investment property for Percy and Emily Cox, residents in Clayfield. The set of two flats are predominately built of timber, with the front of the building stuccoed in the Spanish Mission style. Built by Stones Corner contractor, WR Lee, the interwar duplex is an unusual example of domestic Spanish Mission style architecture. It is important in demonstrating Brisbane's development pattern in the late interwar period, in particular in Camp Hill, and the way in which ideas about acceptable forms of housing were changing.

This is a place of local heritage significance and meets one or more of the local heritage criteria under the Heritage planning scheme policy of the *Brisbane City Plan 2014*. It is significant because:

The place is important in demonstrating the evolution or pattern of the city's or local area's history

for the evidence it provides of the pattern of construction of purpose built flats in Camp Hill during the 1930s and

as a reflection of the growth in popularity of the multi-unit dwelling in Brisbane.

#### Rarity

CRITERION B

The place demonstrates rare, uncommon or endangered aspects of the city's or local area's cultural heritage

as a 1930s Spanish Mission duplex in Camp Hill.
