William Henry Barham (Builder)

This house was built in 1876 by William Henry Barham and bought by the Wade-Brown family in 1911 who lived here until the 1980s. Though the shingle roof has been replaced, it retains its three finials, the dormer windows off attic rooms and the dowel balustrade. The house still stands on its original timber stumps and hand-made nails have been used in the veranda. It originally had maid's quarters at the rear along with a detached kitchen.
