Criterion for listing (A) Historical; (G) Social

Kedron State School was established in 1926 after a great deal of lobbying by the Kedron community to the Department of Public Instruction for the need of a primary school in the area. When first opened, the number of students enrolled was 171. The historically significant structures within the school are block 'B' and 'C'. The state school has served the Kedron community for many years and continues to do so. It is evidence of the suburb's growth in the interwar years.

Statement of significance

Relevant assessment criteria

This is a place of local heritage significance and meets one or more of the local heritage criteria under the Heritage planning scheme policy of the *Brisbane City Plan 2014*. It is significant because:

Historical

CRITERION A

The place is important in demonstrating the evolution or pattern of the city's or local area's history as an interwar primary school built to provide education for the growing suburb's children.

Social

CRITERION G

The place has a strong or special association with the life or work of a particular community or cultural group for social, cultural or spiritual reasons

as a primary school which has played a role in many of the lives of Kedron residents from the 1920s.
