This war memorial was placed at the intersection of Moggill and Brookfield Roads. Construction was undertaken by the prominent stonemasons A.L. Petrie & Sons. Opened on 3 July 1920, the Memorial originally included a single flagstaff and timber & wire boundary fence. In 1969, it was relocated to the Kenmore Village shopping centre carpark due to roadworks. In April 1987, the memorial underwent restoration before being moved 452 metres to a new memorial park 'Pike Place' on Brookfield Road in October 1988. This was funded as a Bicentennial Project.

Statement of significance

Relevant assessment criteria

This is a place of local heritage significance and meets one or more of the local heritage criteria under the Heritage planning scheme policy of the *Brisbane City Plan 2014*. It is significant because:

Historical

CRITERION A

The place is important in demonstrating the evolution or pattern of the city's or local area's history

as a collection of commemorative monuments recording the district's involvement in the Boer War and the major offensives of the 20th century.

Representative

CRITERION D

The place is important in demonstrating the principal characteristics of a particular class or classes of cultural places

as commemorative structures erected as enduring records of major historical events.

Social

CRITERION G

The place has a strong or special association with the life or work of a particular community or cultural group for social, cultural or spiritual reasons

as a sacred and special place for commemorating their involvement of the district in the Boer War and their major offensives of the 20th century.

Historical association

CRITERION H

The place has a special association with the life or work of a particular person, group or organization of importance in the city's or local area's history

the Boer War/Great War monument, as an example of the work of the notable monumental masonry firm, A.L. Petrie.
