St Alban the Martyr Anglican Church

This brick church was opened on Anzac Day 1929 and was constructed in response to the needs of the Anglican Congregation in the newly formed parish of Wilston. The church has a longstanding connection with the parishioners of Wilston and has remained in continuous use since its construction. The church was dedicated to parishioners, friends and relatives who had served or perished during World War One.

Statement of significance

Relevant assessment criteria

This is a place of local heritage significance and meets one or more of the local heritage criteria under the Heritage planning scheme policy of the *Brisbane City Plan 2014*. It is significant because:

Historical

CRITERION A

The place is important in demonstrating the evolution or pattern of the city's or local area's history

as it is a purpose built place of worship that was constructed in response to the needs of the growing Anglican community in Wilston during the interwar period.

Social

CRITERION G

The place has a strong or special association with the life or work of a particular community or cultural group for social, cultural or spiritual reasons

as it is a 1920s church that has remained in continuous use thereby playing a prominent and enduring part in the lives of the successive generations who attended services and/or received religious instruction on this site.
